Judging Process

A panel of three or more faculty, staff, or community members will judge each round. Each judge will award up to 50 points. The two presenters with the highest combined point totals will move forward in the competition.

Following a presentation heat, the judges are given the opportunity to review and update scores. This allows for a more balanced evaluation of the presenters and mitigates the impact of presentation order in judging. The decision of the judges is final. Heat results will be announced at the end of the competition day.

In the case of a tie, judges will review the scores of the presenters involved and discuss which presenter best fits the spirit of the Grad Slam competition. Again, the decision of the judges is final.

Judges are encouraged to give written feedback to presenters. Presenters will receive this feedback after their competition day.
